## Reformation Day Observed October 27<sup>th</sup>- Anno Domini 2024

What made Jerusalem, also known as Mount Zion, so great was that God had put his name on her. Her towers and fortresses were only signs of their true tower and fortress, the Lord of hosts himself. He is greatly to be praised in the city of our God. This is what made Jerusalem the holy city. Psalm 48, which serves as the basis for our *Gradual*, describes how God has made himself known as the fortress for his people. The Psalm describes how kings assembled together but then took to flight at God's protection. This is what happened when the king of Assyria, Sennacherib, attacked Jerusalem in the days of King Hezekiah. Hezekiah prayed to the Lord at this time, confessing that the works of men's hands cannot save, but only the Lord can save. Then the Angel of the Lord went out and struck down 185,000 of Sennacherib's army, and Sennacherib went back to Nineveh disgraced (Isaiah 37).

This same Hezekiah boldly made reforms in the temple, returning to the Word of God, since it had been polluted by human hands (2 Chron 29). To return to the truth of the Word of God is to return to give all glory to Christ and not put our trust in our own righteous works. Christ, the Son of God, is our righteousness by which we stand forgiven of our sins and bold to confess his Word. As the Psalm also says, "Your right hand is filled with righteousness." So we are admonished to walk about Zion and consider her ramparts. In other words, consider what the church is all about. Consider how our worship of God centers on how he saves us from sin, delivers us from evil, and declares us righteous in his sight for the sake of Christ, his right hand and holy arm. This is so that you may also tell the next generation about this God. Teach your children to confess God's Word with the confidence that Christ stands for us as our fortress and rock.

<sup>12</sup> So the Levites got started. From Kohath's descendants: Mahath, Amasai's son, and Joel, Azariah's son. From Merari's descendants: Kish, Abdi's son, and Azariah, Jehallelel's son. "We have cleansed all of the LORD's temple," they said, "and the altar for burnt offerings with all its utensils, the table with the rows of bread on it and all its utensils, <sup>19</sup> also all the utensils King Ahaz threw out when he was king and unfaithful. We have restored them and sanctified them, and there they are in front of the LORD's altar."



# Large Catechism Part III Smalcald Articles

Article III - Of Repentance.

39 Of this repentance John preaches, and afterwards Christ in the Gospel, and we also. By this [preaching of] repentance we dash to the ground the Pope and everything that is built upon our good works. For all is built upon a rotten and vain foundation, which is called a good work or law, even though no good work is there, but only wicked works, and no one does the Law (as Christ, John 7:19, says), but all transgress it. Therefore the building [that is raised upon it] is nothing but falsehood and hypocrisy, even [in the part] where it is most holy and beautiful.

40 And in Christians this repentance continues until death, because, through the entire life it contends with sin remaining in the flesh, as Paul, Rom. 7:14-25, [shows] testifies that he wars with the law in his members, etc.; and that, not by his own powers, but by the gift of the Holy Ghost that follows the remission of sins. This gift daily cleanses and sweeps out the remaining sins, and works so as to render man truly pure and holy.

41 The Pope, the theologians, the jurists, and every other man know nothing of this [from their own reason], but it is a doctrine from heaven, revealed through the Gospel, and must suffer to be called heresy by the godless saints [or hypocrites].

42 On the other hand, if certain sectarists would arise, some of whom are perhaps already extant, and in the time of the insurrection [of the peasants] came to my own view, holding that all those who had once received the Spirit or the forgiveness of sins, or had become believers, even though they should afterwards sin, would still remain in the faith, and such sin would not harm them, and [hence] crying thus: "Do whatever you please; if you believe, it all amounts to nothing; faith blots out all sins," etc.—they say, besides, that if any one sins after he has received faith and the Spirit, he never truly had the Spirit and faith: I have had before me [seen and heard] many such insane men, and I fear that in some such a devil is still remaining [hiding and dwelling].
