The Twenty-fourth Sunday after Trinity November 10th -- anno Domini 2024

"You will bear witness." Jesus spoke these words to his apostles, because they were with him from the beginning of his ministry, and they would be witnesses of his death and resurrection. We hear a lot about witnessing among Christians. But what does this mean? True Christian witnessing is not talking to people about what God has done in your life. These might make for stories of encouragement as we bear with one another in love. But true witnessing of which Jesus speaks is the witness of his apostles. They witnessed what Christ did. He lived a perfect life teaching only what was pleasing to God. He did not falter in a single part of God's Word. He fulfilled the words of the prophets. He lived a perfect life on behalf of all poor sinners whose lives and works can't possibly meet up to God's law. He died on the cross, bearing the eternal wrath of God against sinners. He paid to God's eternal law what we could not pay. He rose from the dead, proving that his Word and his work were true. This is the witness of the apostles. This is the true Christian witness.

This is what the Holy Spirit bears witness to through his Word. It is therefore the mission-proclaimation of the church. Our mission is not to create a safe and comfortable atmosphere of fellowship. Our mission is to proclaim from the witness of his faithful apostles what Christ has done. This witness alone is what creates fellowship and love among Christians, because this is the witness of the Spirit of truth who alone unites our hearts, minds, and mouths to confess his truth. Everything we teach about the triune God, whether his creation of the world and of man and woman, the fall of man into sin, God's judgment against all sins, that we are not saved by what we do, that our baptism saves us, that the Lord's Supper is the true body and blood of Jesus -- all of this is united to the witness concerning Christ, who he is, and what he did. So when we must bear the contempt of the world, we, by God's grace, keep this witness in mind.

Large Catechism Part III Smalcald Articles

Article V - Of Baptism.

1 Baptism is nothing else than the Word of God in the water, commanded by His institution, or, as Paul says, a washing in the Word; as also Augustine says: Let the Word come to the element, and it becomes a Sacrament. 2 And for this reason we do not hold with Thomas and the monastic preachers [or Dominicans] who forget the Word (God's institution) and say that God has imparted to the water a spiritual power, which through the water washes away sin. 3 Nor [do we agree] with Scotus and the Barefooted monks [Minorites or Franciscan monks], who teach that, by the assistance of the divine will, Baptism washes away sins, and that this ablution occurs only through the will of God, and by no means through the Word or water.

4 Of the baptism of children we hold that children ought to be baptized. For they belong to the promised redemption made through Christ, and the Church should administer it [Baptism and the announcement of that promise] to them.
